He was preceded in death by his grandmothers, Ruth Keys and Virginia Daniels.

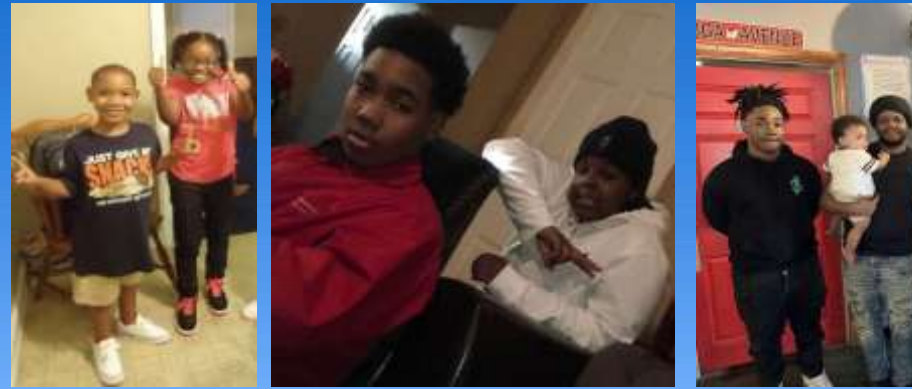
