Reflections of the Life of Apostle Alva Marie Wiggins Green

Apostle Alva Marie Wiggins Green, a devoted servant of God, loving matriarch, and respected community leader, transitioned peacefully, leaving behind a legacy of faith, strength, and compassion.

Born on March 20, 1944, in Columbia, South Carolina, Alva was the beloved daughter of the late James and Myrtis Wiggins. From an early age, she demonstrated a deep sense of purpose and spiritual calling that would shape the course of her life.

Apostle Green was the cherished wife of Apostle Alvin Green of World Harvest Ministries in Columbia, South Carolina. Her spiritual journey was profound, as she was born again in 1980 and soon after answered the call to become an intercessor and prayer warrior in 1981. In 2000, she was ordained as a Prophet, and in 2006, she was elevated to the office of Apostle.

She was the founder of the prayer group “Those Praying Women and Men,” where she faithfully trained and mentored individuals to grow in spiritual discipline and prayer. Apostle Green had a special heart for ministering to broken and hurting women, walking boldly in apostolic authority with a strong anointing in deliverance and the prophetic.

Apostle Green was a lifelong learner who valued both education and spiritual growth. She attended C. A. Johnson High School and went on to earn a diploma in Biblical Studies from Glory Land Bible College. She furthered her studies at Christian Life School of Theology, where she obtained both her bachelor’s and master’s degrees. In recognition of her dedication and impact in ministry, she was also honored with an Honorary Doctorate Degree from St. Thomas Christian College.

In addition to her ministry work, Apostle Green retired from the Department of Social Services, where she served diligently as a supervisor. Apostle Green was the proud owner of Nation’s Hair Salon. She was also known for her vibrant spirit and was once a competitive swimmer at Drew Park.

Apostle Green’s impact reached far beyond her local community. She was an international conference speaker who ministered in over 11 nations, including Bulgaria, Singapore, Malaysia, Indonesia, Spain, Mexico, and the Netherlands. Her life was a testament to unwavering faith, service, and love. She will be profoundly missed but forever remembered.

Apostle Green was preceded in death by her beloved parents, James Wiggins, Sr. and Myrtis Wiggins; her brother, James Wiggins, Jr.; and her son, Andre Hennie.
