# Reflections of the Life of Ms. Mildred Aline Jacobs Henry

Ms. Mildred Aline Jacobs Henry was born April 1, 1938, to the late Mr. & Mrs. Horace Jacobs in Columbia, South Carolina. Affectionately known as Mickey, she was the fourth of twelve children. Mildred peacefully transitioned on Friday, June 12, 2026, in her loving family home.

In addition to her parents, Mildred was preceded in death by five (5) brothers: Charles (Henrette) Jacobs, Horace (Lillian) Jacobs, Walter Jacobs, Roosevelt (Betty) Jacobs, and Elijah Jacobs; five (5) sisters: Frances (David) Washington, Christine (Issac) Patterson, Mazie (Jimmy) Wilson, Daisy Howell, Brenda Stinney; and one (1) grandchild, Daffanie L. You believed in all of us.

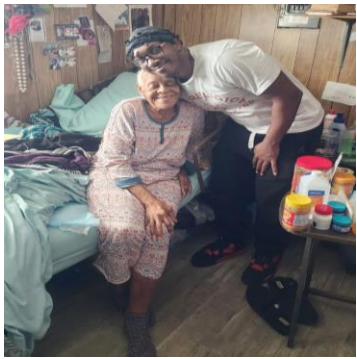
Your quiet sacrifices
