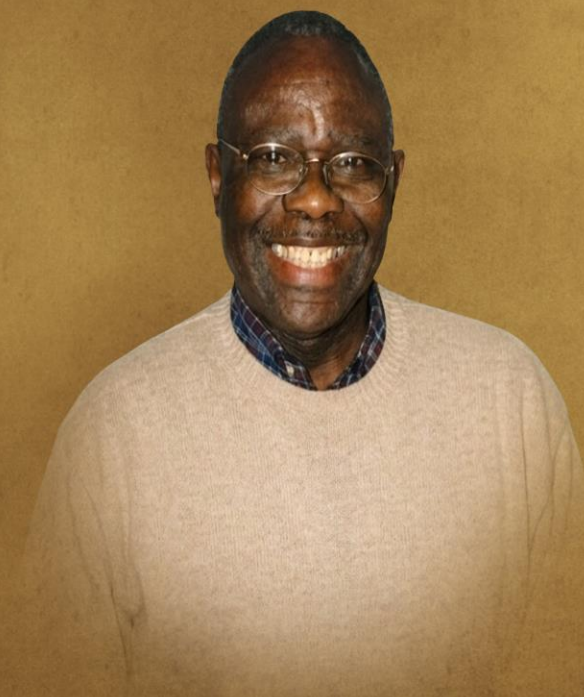


Prayer of St. Francis

Obituary

It is with great sadness that the family of Mr. Johnson Sei Kemi Dolo, (most lovingly referred to as “Dolo” by family and friends) announces his passing. He was born in Nimba County, Liberia, West Africa, in June of 1947 to parents Nyan ZuaDolo and Yei Kono.

Mr. Dolo was educated at the Ganta Methodist School and graduated from the Booker Washington Agricultural & Industrial Institute, now known as the Booker Washington Institute, in Kakata, Liberia, in 1968. After migrating to the U.S., he graduated from Drury College in Springfield, Missouri, in 1977.
