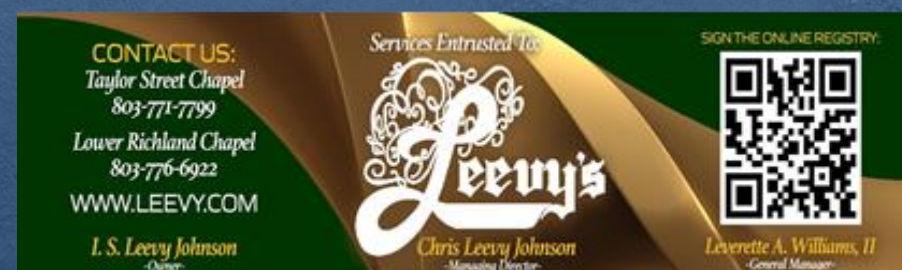

Obituary

Sergeant Leroy Fogle, a devoted husband, father, grandfather, brother, veteran, and friend, peacefully entered eternal rest on Friday, July 24, 2026.

Born on July 13, 1946, in Elloree, South Carolina, Leroy was the beloved son of the late Herbert Fogle and Maggie Fogle. He developed a strong work ethic at an early age and graduated from Roberts High School in 1966.

That same year, Leroy answered the call to serve his country by enlisting in the United States Army. During the Vietnam War, he proudly served with Company B, 2nd Battalion, 12th Cavalry Regiment, 1st Cavalry Division, proudly known as the “1st Air Cavalry,” participating in ground and aerial combat operations. His courage and sacrifice earned him numerous military honors, including the Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart, Air Medal, Combat Infantryman Badge, National Defense Service Medal, and Vietnam Campaign Medal. Following active duty, he continued his service as a member of the United States Army Reserve.

After returning home, Leroy worked for Campbell Soup Company while continuing his education at Orangeburg-Calhoun Technical College. In 1968, he married Georgia Jenkins, and the family later relocated to Connecticut.

Leroy built a respected career as an automotive and transportation mechanic, working at Dwan Ford Lincoln Mercury and Laidlaw Bus Company before retiring as Shop Foreman at DATTCO Transportation. Known for his exceptional mechanical skill and tireless work ethic, Leroy also spent countless hours repairing vehicles from his home garage for family, friends, and neighbors. Helping others was simply part of who he was.

A man of quiet strength and unwavering faith, Leroy was a longtime member of Miracle Faith Outreach in Bridgeport, Connecticut. In his later years, he attended Elevation Church – Ballantyne in Charlotte, North Carolina, both in person and online. Throughout his life, Leroy called South Carolina, Connecticut, and North Carolina home. He spent his final years in Tega Cay, South Carolina, where he was lovingly cared for by his daughter, Kathy Fogle.

To know Leroy was to know a gentle, soft-spoken man with a caring heart, quick wit, and wonderful sense of humor. He loved to sing, dance, fish, watch baseball and football, enjoy a good boxing match, and play cards with family and friends. Music brought him great joy, especially the songs of Chuck Berry, The Williams Brothers, and Sam Cooke. His family will forever treasure the simple things that made Leroy uniquely himself—his laughter, his storytelling, his love of lollipops, and even his favorite breakfast request: “Blueberry oatmeal, scrambled eggs, turkey bacon, and a cup of coffee with just a splash of French vanilla.” These ordinary moments became extraordinary memories.

In addition to his parents, Leroy was preceded in death by his wife, Tracey Ann Fogle; his brothers, Herbert Fogle, Jr., Ezekiel Fogle, and Heyward Fogle; and his sister, Maggie Fogle.

He leaves to cherish his precious memory: his loving children, Brenda Drury (Mike) of Santee, South Carolina, Leroy Mack (Georgia) of Stratford, Connecticut, Kathy Fogle (Brandon Stevens) of Tega Cay, South Carolina, Donnie Fogle (Jenny) of Buford, Georgia, Melinda Fogle and Mechele Fogle, both of Charlotte, North Carolina. He is also survived by his beloved first wife, Georgia Fogle; six devoted sisters, Elizabeth Fogle, Mary Lee Asbury (Morris), Helen Canty (Luther), Mattie Fogle, Marie Fogle, and Dorothy Fogle; one loving brother, David Fogle (Rebecca); 14 cherished grandchildren, 10 beloved great-grandchildren, a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, extended family members, and dear friends.

Sergeant Leroy Fogle’s life reflected humility, courage, perseverance, integrity, faith, and unconditional love. He served his country with honor, loved his family deeply, and leaves behind a legacy that will live on for generations.
