Reflections of the Life of SFC (Ret) Peter Jamison

SFC (Ret) Peter Jamison, affectionately known as "Red," was born February 19, 1939, in Elloree, South Carolina, to the late Daniel Jamison, Sr. and Josephine Zeigler Jamison. He peacefully entered eternal rest on Thursday, July 2, 2026.

SFC (Ret) Jamison proudly served his country in the United States Army for 20 years after enlisting on June 6, 1956, at Fort Jackson in Columbia, South Carolina. A dedicated Military Policeman and Army Recruiter, he served at duty stations throughout the United States, Germany, Korea, the Panama Canal Zone, and Vietnam, where he also served as a Prisoner of War (POW) Advisor. In recognition of his courage, he was awarded the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry. He retired on October 1, 1976, leaving a spirit of honor, dedication, and patriotism. Following his military service, he lived a life defined by kindness, fellowship, and a genuine appreciation for the company of family and friends. His warm personality and welcoming spirit left a lasting impression on everyone he encountered.

A devoted man of faith, Peter was a faithful member of Brown Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church in Elloree, South Carolina, where he found strength in his relationship with God and fellowship with his church family.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his; his twin brother, Paul Jamison; his brothers, Robert L. Jamison, Curtis O'Neal Jamison and John H. Jamison; and his sister, Joanne Jamison.
