With hearts filled with profound sorrow we honor and celebrate the extraordinary life of Austin Dosha LeSane – a devoted husband, loving father and son, treasured friend and faithful servant of God.

Mr. Austin Dosha LeSane, husband of Shemia LeSane, was born in Wedgefield, SC on January 18, 1982, to Mr. Harry Lesane and the late Mrs. Essie LeSane. Austin often reflected on summers in Maysville and Paxville with his cousins and other family members. At an early age, Austin gave his life to Christ and was a member of the Zion Hill Missionary Baptist Church, in Paxville, SC, where he developed a solid foundation. He was a member of The Brook Columbia, where he completed the Brook’s Brothers Discipleship Program and served with the Parking and Security Ministries. Austin graduated from Lakewood High School in 2000. He continued to Pikeville University, where he played on the inaugural football team as a wide receiver. He completed his studies at the University of South Carolina. While there, he double majored in Real Estate and Finance and received a bachelor’s degree in business administration. He played on the Carolina football team as a wide receiver under Coach Lou Holtz before suffering a career ending injury.

After graduating from the University of South Carolina Austin planted roots in Columbia, SC with his wife Shemia and their three children, Autumn, Aubreigh and Austin, Jr. He started his career as a Personal Banker at Wachovia (Wells Fargo) and then went on to work for Target Distribution Center as an Operations Manager. Most recently, he earned his real estate license and began his career with JPAR Magnolia Group, where he launched his journey in the real estate industry. Austin was an avid sports lover. He faithfully cheered for his Carolina Gamecocks, San Antonio Spurs and the San Francisco 49ers. He shared his passion for football with young athletes as a mentor and coach at Ridge View High School.
